River of Lakes Heritage Corridor Story

A historic regional tribe, the Timucua, referred to the St. Johns River as the "Welaka," which meant "River of Lakes." The St. Johns River and series of lakes it connects are an eternal lifeline for centuries of tribes, settlers, travelers and tourists. People as diverse as the Timucua, early Spanish and English settlers, plantation owners, Civil War supply runners, and 1800s steamboat tourists have utilized the St. Johns River for profit, diversion, and survival.

The River of Lakes Heritage Corridor is a Florida Scenic Highway which connects travelers to the numerous cities, towns, heritage and cultural sites in this historic area. The River of Lakes Heritage Corridor embodies a unique blend of sophisticated contemporary culture, rich historic preservation, and gorgeous natural Florida.
